OUTBREAK MANAGEMENT PROCEDURES

- Monitors the outbreak and initiate changes
- Staff to meet online training requirements
- PPE training

 Respiratory infections, including COVID-19, are most commonly spread by contact and droplets.

PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT

- Explain why PPE is important to minimise the spread of COVID-19
- Identify when to use PPE
- Demonstrate how to apply and remove PPE in the correct order
- Applies to all staff and clients



STANDARD PRECAUTIONS KEY ELEMENTS

- Hand hygiene before and after client contact and after contact with potentially contaminated surfaces or objects
- Gloves are not a substitute for hand hygiene. Staff should perform hand hygiene before putting gloves on and after taking them off
- Use of PPE if exposure to body fluids or heavily contaminated surfaces is anticipated (gown, surgical mask, protective eyewear, gloves)
- Cough etiquette and respiratory hygiene (cough into a tissue and discard immediately or into the bend of elbow; perform hand hygiene)
- **Regular cleaning of the environment and equipment**
- Provision of alcohol-based hand sanitiser

PPE AND COVID-19

PPE AND COVID-19

The appropriate PPE to wear for COVID-19 is determined by an assessment of transmission risk.

If the likely risk of COVID-19 transmission is **Low**, use PPE in accordance with existing guidance for standard, contact and droplet precautions. This includes wearing a surgical mask, along with gloves, gown and eye protection.

If the likely risk of COVID-19 transmission is **high**, a particulate filter respirator such as a P2 or N95 respirator should be used, rather than surgical masks, along with gloves, gown and eye protection.

It is essential that staff who use P2/N95 respirators are trained in their correct use. Staff must complete fit testing before first use to select the most suitable respirator and be trained to perform a fit (seal) check properly each time they are used.
